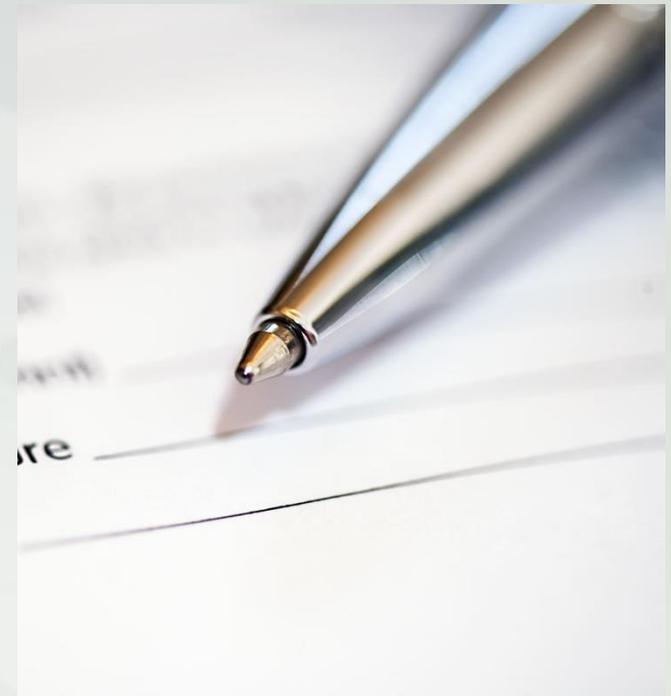

Key Personnel

- NIH defines **key personnel** as: “People who contribute to a project's scientific development or execution in a meaningful way. This can include the program director (PD) or principal investigator (PI), consultants, and others.”
- **Other Significant Contributor:** “Commit to contribute to the scientific development or execution of the project but are not committing any specified measurable effort (person months or percent effort) to the project.”
 - Other Significant Contributors are always key persons
- Other roles may be key or non-key (i.e. Consultants and/or Collaborators)
- Key persons need to include a **biosketch** and an **eRA Commons ID**

Research Security Training

- All key persons **must** complete Research Security Training. This includes non-MSU key personnel.
 - Subawards: the subrecipient letter of commitment includes the requirement, no additional information is needed
 - If the key person is not a part of a subaward they may either:
 - Provide their certificate of training from NSF [NSF Secure Center](#)
 - Provide completion from their home institution
- The training aligns with federal mandates under National Security Presidential Memo-33 (NSPM-33) and the CHIPS and Science Act. This must be completed before submitting your grant application, JIT submission, or RPPRs. You can find more information [here](#). Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program

- All MSU key persons must answer the malign foreign talent program question in the MSU COI module
 - This question is answered in the annual COI disclosure and must have been completed prior to submission
- MSU and Non-MSU employee key persons attest on the new common forms:
 - The new Common Form formats include the following certification, “...I am not a party to a malign foreign talent recruitment program.” For guidance on what a Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program is, see the [chart available on MSU’s Research Security webpage](#).
 - *HFH investigators answer within the HFH COI module

Key Personnel

ORCID & eRA Commons Accounts

Key Personnel – this includes any subaward key persons and/or consultants and collaborators:

- All key persons **MUST** have their ORCID and eRA Commons ID's linked
 - Key persons who do not have a linked account cannot be listed as key persons
- NIH has a validation warning / error that will not allow the proposal to be submitted if accounts are not properly linked
- Your ORCID ID may appear at the top of your biosketch but that does not indicate the accounts have been properly linked
- Only the Investigator (the owner of the SciENcv profile and eRA Commons account) can perform the ORCID ID linking in SciENcv and eRA Commons; delegates cannot complete the linking on their behalf.

ORCID Connect

- ORCID Connect is a handy MSU service that lets faculty link their MSU NetID with their ORCID ID. Think of it like giving your academic work a permanent digital nametag—one that's uniquely yours and helps keep all your research, publications, and professional activities connected across different platforms.
- Why does this matter? With so many researchers out there, ORCID makes sure **your** work stays tied to **you**. Plus, once you're set up, MSU can use this connection to streamline things like research tracking, reporting, and compliance.

How to link accounts

- Login to your eRA Commons account
- Go into your Personal Profile
- At the bottom there will be an option to ‘create or connect your ORCID ID’,

- First step is to manage your citations to your My bibliography and ensure it is complete with all of your citations.
- Verify you only have 1 account and there are no issues with your accounts.
- Login to your MyNCBI

Biosketch Overview

- **No more page limits!!**
- Fellowships; scholastic performance no longer required/accepted
- Biosketch Common Form and Bioskech Supplement
 - Appointments and Positions
 - Senior/key persons must only identify all domestic and foreign professional appointments and positions outside of the primary organization for a period up to three years from the date the applicant submits the application to the agency for funding consideration.
 - Products
 - up to 5 Products Closely Related to the Proposed Project;
 - up to 5 Other Significant Products Highlighting Contributions to Science.
 - Personal statement (no citations); 3,500 characters
 - Honors; limit to **15** entries
 - Contributions to science:
 - Limit of **5** narrative contributions; 2,000 characters
 - Do not provide citations
 - May reference relevant products from Other Significant Products

New Common Forms

Current / Pending (Other) Support

- The Current and Pending (Other) Support Common Form is required by each individual identified as a senior/key person on a Federally funded research project (excluding Other Significant Contributors). For NIH, these instructions also apply to all other individuals required to submit Current and Pending (Other) Support.
- Other Support encompasses all resources available to a researcher for any of their research activities, including those without monetary value or not based at their primary institution
- Information on Current and Pending (Other) Support is not specifically requested for Program Directors, training faculty, and other individuals involved in the oversight of training grants since applicable information is collected in other sections of a training grant application. Current and Pending (Other) Support is not required to be submitted for individuals categorized as Other Significant Contributors.

What to include in your Other Support

- All active or pending grants from federal, state, local, foreign, private, and foundation sources.
- In-kind contributions, including resources like office/laboratory space, equipment, supplies, or personnel provided by an external source.
 - *Note:* In-kind contributions without monetary value or a time commitment do not require reporting.
- Research activities, including participation in government-sponsored talent recruitment programs (Note: both Foreign and domestic research activities need to be reported).
- Consulting that involves performing research.
- Start-up funds from organizations other than the institution receiving the award.
- Research collaborations that have a time commitment

What not to include in your Other Support

- Prizes and training grants.
- Institutional resources generally available to researchers, such as core facilities.
- Other Significant Contributors (OSC) are not required to submit Other Support information.
 - How do you report 0 person months?
 - SciENcv is currently working on an update to allow 0 persons months effort to be entered, until there is a fix, you may use the old form OR enter 0.01 person months effort and provide a statement in the Overall Objectives clarifying the 0.01 effort in year X is actually 0.00. 0 person months is only acceptable with an appropriate explanation

2026 updates

- You are required to use SciENcv to generate the forms and link your ORCID ID to your eRA Commons account.
- You must personally certify the form, confirming its accuracy and your non-participation in a Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program (MFTRP).
- If you personally signed agreements with foreign entities for activities that are reported on your Current / Pending Support form, send the agreement to OSP for review and submission to NIH.
